The work of eight artists is the latest exhibition at the ever popular Foxlowe Gallery. As the title CORNUCOPIA implies this is a varied exhibition. A group of five painters, two ceramicists and a textile artist have contributed to keep the field as broad as possible to create an exhibition of wide ranging imagery and ideas that simultaneously complement and contrast each other in quite vibrant ways.

The ceramicists, Ruth Robinson and Jeff Teasdale work with clays from opposite ends of the spectrum, Jeff with his "raku", highly textured with viscous glazing and Ruth with fine delicate porcelain.

The painters, five of them, Bruce Lyons, Lucy Bennett, Colin Grimes, Stewart Griffin and Phil Bennett, work in very different ways, using oils and acrylics in a wide range of responses to the visual world. The work here is deliberately contrasting in style and imagery, low key and high key colour, abstract and representational, observed and imagined.

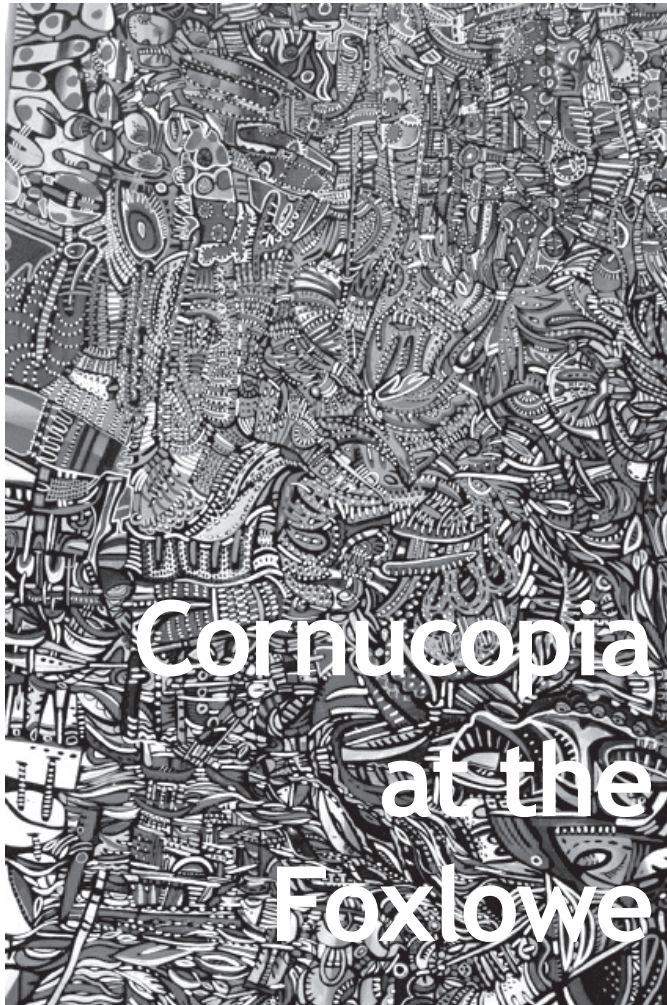
The textile artist, Suzy Shackleton, works in felts, producing unique and powerful images in brilliant colour in a medium many viewers will find new and exciting.

**The exhibition explores different ways of seeing, where the ordinary and mundane can be transformed into exciting visual experiences where the viewer can be confronted with the usual and the unusual and given space to ponder and make their own connection with the work and the artists ideas.**

The curators of this, the fourth exhibition at the Foxlowe Gallery, are Phil & Pat Bennett. Both have been involved in art education for many years. Now residing in Leek, Phil has also been a member of ArtsXtra, a Macclesfield Co-operative.

**The Exhibition Preview starts at 6.30pm on Friday the 13th April. All are welcome and the bar will be open.**

## **Croissants Masterclass** presented by Janet Broome

In 1986 *Take Six Cooks* was the first cookery programme on tv. It featured Raymond Blanc and five other outstanding chefs. The patisserie section especially interested me as it is acknowledged to be the most difficult skill to perfect. I went to Michael Nadell's bakery at the Angel, Islington and he told me that he used Anchor butter for croissants. Obviously, the ingredients used in recipes affect the result. I have made a special study of bread that has involved trips to New York and Paris. The making of croissants involves two intervals of ten minutes and one of fifteen minutes while the gluten relaxes and the butter firms up. During these periods I will tell you some of the fascinating history of bread together with shocking details of a day course taught by Dan Lepard of the *Guardian*.
